

Joint Annual Meeting of
Buckton & Coxall and Brampton Bryan Parishes
Brampton Bryan Parish Hall, Tuesday 3 May 2016, 7:30pm

Present: Parish Councillors Maggie Brown, Paul Derrick (Chair) and Susan Harley
Also present: 1 resident from Buckton & Coxall.

1. **Apologies** – none.
2. **Minutes of the last meeting** were read out and signed as correct.
3. **Public Consultation on Speed Indicator Devices (SIDS)**

Buckton & Coxall : A notice had been displayed and the Consultation had been discussed with as many people as possible in Buckton & Coxall and Walford. Response : people are generally in favour.

Brampton Bryan: A notice had been displayed on the BGPC board. A number of people had been contacted by email, but no one had been approached in person.

Responses had been received as follows:

Buckton & Coxall	5 for	0 against
Brampton Bryan	7 for	2 against

Those against SIDS were for the idea of putting 'Dead Slow' on the road, and/or flowers/gates at the entrance to the village. It was felt that SIDS would be a visual intrusion, and would urbanise the area.

It was agreed that if the poles could be removed between uses, the visual intrusion would be minimized.

(It should be noted that further responses are likely to come in after this meeting.)

The topic of speeding is often raised in the area, and SIDS would remind people of the speed limit, and demonstrate that BGPC takes the issue seriously and is trying to address the concerns of local people.

4. **Litter** : It is too dangerous to pick up litter on A roads. Cllrs were not convinced that people would respond to the idea of organised litter picking. How can people be persuaded to not drop litter in the first place? Could schools help children understand the issue?
5. **Jetting Culverts** : Flooding is still an issue in particular between Walford & Buckton, and opposite Weymore Cottages. Could BGPC apply pressure on Balfour Beatty to continue cleaning out the culvert under the A4113 and the U92002 Weymore Lane, Coxall? Is the Lengthsman able to take this task on?
6. **Grass Triangle in Buckton** : A resident raised the issue of the grass being damaged by the Wigmore school bus. They had approached the driver, and had an aggressive response. Could BGPC write to ask the driver not to cut across the corner of the triangle?
